Adversary

WHERE CAN I FIND IT?


There are two books named Peter in the New Testament - First Peter and Second Peter. They are the 21st and 22nd books of the New Testament. If you find First Peter chapter five verse eight you will locate the big word ADVERSARY.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

A person who is your ADVERSARY is your ENEMY. An enemy is someone who opposes or is against you. The opposite person to an ADVERSARY is an ADVOCATE. An advocate is someone who is your friend and who defends you. Throughout your life you will have friends and you will have enemies. But always you will have one chief enemy and one chief friend. Your worst enemy will be the Devil and your best friend will be God. The verse in I Peter 5:8 tells you how fierce an enemy the Devil is. He is so menacing he would eat you! Ugh!

HOW CAN I USE IT?

You can use the word ADVERSARY to remind you to be vigilant just as it says in the verse. When an enemy is about - look out! Be watchful! Don't let that big beast the Devil catch you or tempt you. Remember your ADVOCATE, your friend and defender, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will protect you. The Devil is no match for Him! Stay on His side.

WHERE CAN I FIND IT?

Do you know where the First book of Corinthians is? It is the seventh book of the New Testament and it comes right after the book called Romans. In First Corinthians chapter sixteen verse twenty-two the word ANATHEMA is found.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

If a person or a place is CURSED it is assigned or reserved for SEPARATION FROM GOD. This is very awesome and sad. It means that God will never love that person nor dwell in that place. It will for ever be empty. ANATHEMA means God is FINISHED with the person who does not love Him and He will not go into a place where He is not honoured. You will see that the word which follows it in First Corinthians 16 verse 22 is also an unusual word. It is the word Maran-atha. That word means 'our Lord cometh' and it reminds us that Jesus is coming back to earth.

HOW CAN I USE IT?

ANATHEMA is something you would never want to be. So this word ought to teach us how wonderful it is to love the Lord Jesus Christ. If we love Him we can never be CURSED or FORGOTTEN by Him. To keep ourselves loving Jesus we need to COMMUNE with Him. Commune

means to keep in touch. We commune with God by reading His words to us in the Bible and by talking to Him in prayer. If we do this we can never ever have the word ANATHEMA applied to us.

Anon

WHERE CAN I FIND IT?

Seeing as this is just a wee word let's look for it in two places! You can find it in the first book of the New Testament - Matthew - chapter 13 verse 20. Then look in the second book - Mark - chapter 1 and verse 30.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

This tiny word actually has two meanings. When you read the word ANON in the Bible it means IMMEDIATELY or STRAIGHT AWAY. That's nice and easy to understand, isn't it? Often you will come across this word in other things which you read. Usually it refers to the word ANONYMOUS and it will be written with a little dot after the letter 'N', like so - ANON. But in the two verses which you looked up in the Bible it simply means IMMEDIATELY.

HOW CAN I USE IT?

If you read the two stories in the Bible where this word ANON is used you will learn that in both it teaches us how quickly responses were made by those involved in the stories. Very often we need to be quick in our reactions and not old slow coaches who are behind in everything!
